A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MANDEVILLE IN SUPPORT OF DECLARING FRIDAY, JULY 5, 2024, A LEGAL HOLIDAY FOR CITY OF MANDEVILLE EMPLOYEES, COMMEMORATING THE ADOPTION OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE IN KEEPING WITH GOVERNOR LANDRY'S PROCLAMATION NUMBER 41 JML 2024 AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, City of Mandeville law recognized the legal, historical, and cultural significance of Independence Day, Thursday, July 4, 2024, as a legal holiday, pursuant to Sec. 2-1 – Legal holidays of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Mandeville; and

WHEREAS, LA R.S. 1:55(B)(3) empowers the Governor of Louisiana to authorize, by Executive Proclamation, the observance by the departments of the State of other holidays and half-holidays that the Governor deems in keeping with efficient administration; and

WHEREAS, on June 24, 2024, under Proclamation No. 41 JML 2024 and by virtue of the authority vested by the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, Governor Landry declared Friday, July 5, 2024, a legal holiday and a day of public rest in the State of Louisiana; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Mandeville hereby declares Friday, July 5, 2024, a legal holiday and a day of rest for all City of Mandeville employees.


